USICH Framework for Ending Youth Homelessness

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Opening Doors

No one should experience homelessness and no one should be without a safe, stable place to call home.

The Plan set forth four bold and ambitious goals:

1. Finish the job of ending chronic homelessness by 2015
2. Prevent and end homelessness among Veterans by 2015
- 3. Prevent and end homelessness for families, youth, and children by 2020**
4. Set a path to ending all types of homelessness




Federal Framework for Ending Youth Homelessness

Strategy I: Getting to Better Data


- A confident estimate of youth homelessness
- Data coordination, youth PIT strategy, and household survey

Strategy II: Building Capacity for Service Delivery

- A research-informed intervention model
- Review research and apply to intervention strategies
- Increased evidence of effective interventions
- Identify and scale-up evidence-based practices and increase rigorous evaluation
- Gaps analysis
- Investigate funding and capacity needs of programs

Cabinet Secretaries Advance Efforts to End Family Homelessness

On July 9th, the Obama Administration convened a meeting to push forward its agenda to end homelessness. USICH Chair, VA Secretary Eric K. Shinseki, and Vice Chair, HUD Secretary Shaun



Donovan, met with other Council leaders including ED Secretary Arne Duncan and DOL Acting Secretary Seth Harris, USICH Executive Director Barbara J. Poppe, Chief Executive Officer of the Corporation for National and Community Service Wendy Spencer, Director of the White House Office of Faith-Based and Neighborhood Partnerships Melissa Rogers, and representatives from 11 other member agencies. The group discussed ways to leverage opportunities created by the Affordable Care Act and ways to better serve families who are experiencing homelessness. Donna Seymour, Acting Deputy Assistant Secretary for Warrior Care Policy at the Department of Defense, also updated the Council on DoD's efforts since the last Council meeting to coordinate transitions from active service to Veteran status for our



Interagency Coordination

For USICH's Homeless Youth/Families Frameworks:

- Our agencies will reach out to regional (USICH), State (EHCY) and local level (HUD) contacts next year to determine whether efforts are being made to reach out and/or respond. Please tell me if they aren't.
- Focus for implementation of Youth Framework in 2014 will be on Federal agency (grantee) capacity, coordinating services and targeting interventions to subgroups
- Families Framework has a data coordination strategy for further aligning ED-HUD data standards, policies for disclosure of aggregate data and PII, and highlighting places with good data coordination

CSPR/EDFacts Submission and Verification Timeline

Submission (Oct-Dec)

- **12/19 (Thurs):** Last day for EDFacts submission
- **12/20 (Fri) 5 pm EST: CSPR Part I certification deadline**

Review & Recertify (Jan-Feb)

- **12/23-1/31:** ED & NCHE check data and prepare comments
- **2/3-2/21:** States review comments and prepare corrections
- **2/24-3/7:** CSPR Part I reopens for recertification

Final Review (Mar-Apr)

- **3/10-21:** NCHE and ED check data again, may contact States
- **3/24:** Notified for late opening April 14-16

ED Use and Release of SY 2012-13 CSPR Data

Spring into Summer 2014:

- GPRA measures calculated and ED Facts LEA level data checked

Late Summer/Fall 2014:

- SY 12-13 data made public on ED Data Express, NCHE's State Pages and in a shorter national data summary

Fall 2014:

- LEA and school-level academic achievement data on homeless students, if not demographic data, available at www.explore.data.gov

ED Disclosure of LEA and School Data

- Since January 2013, ED has begun posting academic achievement and other data at the LEA and school level on www.explore.data.gov, including homeless students as a subgroup, grades 3-8
- Last week SY 11-12 data on reading and math proficiency for homeless students at LEA and school level were made available at https://explore.data.gov/browse?Dataset-Summary_Agency=Department+of+Education&utf8=%E2%9C%93 (filter on top right for recently updated)
- We'll also send NCHE the 4 national Excel files and you can request them: consider sharing these data with SEA staff who focus on SIG and Priority and Focus schools for ESEA Flexibility



EHCY Leading Indicator Development

- ED-NCHE group will kick off in January
- Consult with an ad-hoc group of State Coordinators in developing the logic model and proposed leading indicators
- Present to all State Coordinators by June and conduct a poll or vote
- Calculate base-lines for indicators using available data by September
- Begin public clearance process through OMB for any new data collection or new GPRA measures
- Ideas: attendance, dropout, discipline, racial/ethnic, transportation, school of origin maintenance
