<b><u>Eligibility</u></b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Migratory: The child, parent/guardian or their spouse moved across school district lines within the past 3 years</li> <li>• Farmworker or Fisher: The child, parent/guardian or their spouse worked in the temporary or seasonal agriculture and fishing industries.</li> </ul>	<p>Lack a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence, including children and youth:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sharing housing due to loss of housing or economic hardship</li> <li>• Living in motels, hotels, trailer parks or camping grounds due to lack of alternative adequate housing</li> <li>• Living in emergency or transitional housing</li> <li>• Abandoned in hospitals</li> <li>• Having a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for, or ordinarily used as, regular sleeping accommodations</li> <li>• Living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations</li> <li>• Migratory students meeting the descriptions above</li> </ul>
